From May 20, 2021, **Evacuate upon the Evacuation Instruction**

Evacuation Recommendations will no longer be issued



Note 1: Alert level 5 is not always issued because, for example, municipal authorities are unable to accurately grasp the status of a disaster.


Note 2: The evacuation instruction will be issued at the same timing that the evacuation recommendation was issued under the previous system.

Note 3: Alert level 3 is the time when people other than the elderly, etc. should also begin to adjust their behavior or prepare for evacuation where necessary, or evacuate of their own accord if they sense a danger to their lives.

Alert level 5 indicates a life-threatening situation in which you can no longer evacuate safely. Do not wait for the alert level 5, Emergency Safety Measures to be issued!

Evacuation Recommendation will no longer be issued. From now on, all residents should evacuate from dangerous places upon the alert level 4, Evacuation Instruction.

Elderly people or people with disabilities, who may need more time to evacuate, should evacuate from dangerous places upon the alert level 3, Evacuation of the Elderly, Etc.



Going outside during torrential rains is dangerous, even in a car. If you have no choice but to spend the night in your car, take great care to check your surroundings, etc., to make sure you are not caught in a flood.
